Ask this question in two parts if you're asking about both access/affordability and understanding	good	this may result in some "I'm not sure" answers as they likely won't have a reference for how much this might cost, or what kind of information exists	good	Focus on access and understanding (not affordability)
A new dam is under construction and the developer is looking for labourers. Is this a good livelihood option for you?	no (too subjective)	good	good	good
An NGO is offering microloans to small-scale female farmers. Are you eligible for these?	good			good
